## The Following Information has been Prepared for You:

A chalazion is a blockage of oil flow out of one of the oil glands in the eyelid. It is sometimes tender, red, and swollen, but after a few days, it becomes a non-tender bump on the eyelid. Very large ones can cause blurred vision. These oil entrapments can be treated by applying special heated moist compresses, pressure and massage, and using oral antibiotic medication to thin secretions. Chalazions have the best outcomes when treatment begins early. Sometimes, they may last a few months before completely resolving, or one may be followed by another over several years. Chalazion resistant to treatment may be excised through an in-office surgical procedure or injected with corticosteroid medications. Patients that have repeat chalazions should consider taking an oral Omega 3 supplement to assist the oil glands in excretion.

Eyelid conditions should be carefully examined by an eye doctor to reduce the risk of scarring of the eyelid margin, which can cause loss of eyelashes, ingrown eyelashes or brittle and thin eyelashes. Chronic blepharitis will lead to atrophied and permanently damaged meibomian glands and severe dry eye disease.

Your doctor may have recommended any combination of the treatments below. Please follow the recommendations discussed

Contact our office with any significant vision changes or emergencies that you feel require immediate attention.

Consistently warm, moist compresses applied to the eyelids for 15 minutes, 4 times per day. Wash your hands and follow compresses with massage and pressure to the eyelid margin, to assist in expression of the oil glands. We offer our preferred brands of moist compresses for purchase at the front desk.

\_\_\_\_ Use the recommended medicated eyelid cleanser 2 times per day, scrubbing each eyelid individually from the inside to the outside corner in a horizontal, left and right motion. To scrub the top lid, close your eye. To scrub the bottom lid, look up and be careful to avoid scratching the ocular surface. Use a mirror to assist. For Demodex infection, also clean the eyebrows and any facial hair, and use shampoo with tea tree oil for the rest of your hair. If you have acne or rosacea (dilated capillaries around your eyelids, nose or cheeks), you should use the cleanser on the whole face, chest or back, depending on affected areas.
